



## Make Your Own Fun Stuff



**Keep the kids busy for hours with these great ideas for home fun!**

### Soap Crayons

#### Ingredients:

- 2 tablespoons hot water
- 1 cup soap flakes
- food colouring

#### Method:

1. Mix hot water and soap flakes together until smooth
2. Divide into 4 small bowls and add food colouring
3. Firmly press mixture into ice-cube trays
4. Leave trays in a dry place to set
5. It takes about 48 hours for crayons to set



## Slime

### Ingredients:

- 1 box Soap flakes
- 1250ml Water
- food Coloring

### Method:

1. Mix all ingredients together, stirring consistently until smooth
2. This recipe makes about 4 litres
3. Slime can be reused after it has dried out. To do this, finely crumble dried slime into bowl and add water 1 teaspoon at a time until it is restored to its original consistency

## Slime 2

### Ingredients:

- 1 cup water
- 2 cups corn flour
- food colouring

### Method:

1. Mix all ingredients together, stirring consistently until smooth



## Goop

### Ingredients:

- 1 cup liquid starch
- 2 cups white glue
- food colouring

### Method:

1. Add starch to glue until mixture becomes a workable ball
2. Add a small amount of colouring and kneed through
3. Store in refrigerator in a covered container

## Putty



### Ingredients:

- 1 pack gelatine
- 2 cups flour
- 1 cup salt
- 4 tablespoons cream of tartar
- 2 cups boiling water
- 2 tablespoons cooking oil

### Method:

1. Mix gelatin, flour, salt and cream of tartar in saucepan
2. Add the boiling water and oil
3. Stir over medium heat until the mixture joins together like dough
4. Form a ball with the putty
5. Place the ball on baking paper to cool
6. Store in an airtight container

You can buy flavored gelatine such as strawberry to make putty with a nice smell!



## Modeling Clay

### Ingredients:

- ½ cup corn flour
- 1 cup salt
- ¾ cup water

### Method:

1. Place all ingredients into a saucepan
2. Stir over a medium heat (do not boil) until mixture follows the spoon
3. Allow to cool and use within 48 hours
4. Place modeled items in a dry place and leave for 4 days. They can then be painted.
